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## Term 1 Week 1, 29th January 2021

Welcome back to school to all students, parents and staff. We are looking forward to a wonderful year ahead!

We welcomed 75 new Reception students and 14 students who transferred from other schools this week. We are enjoying getting to know our new students and familiarising them with their new school. We also welcomed three new staff members; Louise Faulkner, Anneliese Dijkmans and Abbey Thackray.

This year we extend a special "welcome back" to our Year 6 and Year 7 students who are in their final year of primary school. With the new "Year 7 to High School" policy in South Australian public schools, our current Year 6 students will be the *first group* of Year 6 students to graduate from Primary School and our current Year 7 students will be the *last group* of Year 7 students to graduate from Primary School! We wish them all an enjoyable graduate year.



In addition to our learning programs and extra curricula offerings, 2021 will be a busy year for us as our new 6 million dollar building project will begin. We are currently at the Master Plan stage whereby we are working with architects to develop the overall concept for a new library and two new learning spaces. Building should begin in the latter half of this year.

Next week all students will bring home an Information Pack to provide classroom-specific information for parents. The Information Packs will also contain various consent forms to be returned to school including an early dismissal form which is now a departmental requirement for the last day of each term. An outline of the Parent Reporting and Communication timeline for 2021 is enclosed.

As we begin this new year, we invite all parents to let us know if and when there is an issue or query that we can help with. Although physical distancing requirements are currently restricting parents from entering classrooms, we welcome emails and phone calls (and can schedule meetings) as needs arise. ## School Yard Opening & Closing Times

The school yard is supervised by a yard duty teacher each morning before school from 8:30am. We ask that parents and students do not enter the yard, the playground or oval before this time as those areas are used for the Out of School Hours Care (OSHC) program until 8:30am.

Between 8:30am and 8:50am, all students are invited to play on the Hard Play and Botany areas until classroom doors open (playground/oval/nature play areas are unsupervised and therefore not open prior to the school bell).

The OSHC program also uses external play areas including the yard, the COLA, the playground and the oval each afternoon. We ask that parents vacate those areas by 3:30pm to enable OSHC staff to have clear view and duty of care of students who are using OSHC services.

# Classroom Door Opening Times

Our school day begins at 8:50am. While some teachers open their doors earlier than this, our requirement is that doors will open by 8:50am and that learning begins shortly after morning routines are taken care of. Unfortunately entry to classrooms continue to be restricted to staff and students due to COVID physical distancing requirements.

# SAPSASA NEWS

Is your child interested in sports? Would they be interested in representing Golden Grove Primary School, the Tea Tree Gully District or The State? Here is the information you need to know.



Golden Grove Primary School Teams: Each term, GGPS enters

School District Carnivals. These events encourage participation, teamwork and having a go! At the beginning of the year during PE lessons, Bruce Pearce asks students to nominate and record their interest. Closer to the date of the Carnival, students then trial and may get selected. Practices are usually during recess/lunch breaks and during PE lessons. A team, then represents Golden Grove Primary School, competing against other local schools at the one day carnival. A consent form goes home the week prior to the Carnival and will usually cost \$5. On the following page is a calendar of the School District Carnivals we will be entering this year.

**State Carnivals:** Throughout the year there are State Carnivals where students have the opportunity to represent The Tree Gully District. These events are for students who have a strength for a certain sport and generally play for a club. As a school, we receive information a week or two before the trials begin. This information is given to classroom teachers to ask for interested students and then a notice goes home to these families. The trials are off site and GGPS is not a part of the practice or selection process. After trials, if students are selected the cost is usually \$100 and runs over 4 days. You can also keep up to date with State Carnivals (Tea Tree Gully District Teams) on Team App or your sporting club.

**Interstate Competitions:** These events, like The State Carnivals, are off site and GGPS is not a part of the practice or selection process. Students that show a very strong ability in a particular sport can trial to represent The State and compete against other states. Sometimes, these events are interstate. The cost can vary. These events will be dependent on travel restrictions due to Covid-19.



# **Australian Army Cadet Unit**

Last year Golden Grove High School was selected to form the Golden Grove Australian Army Cadet Unit. Army Cadets is a youth program that teaches young people to be confident, self-sufficient and willing to "have a go". The Australian Army cadets (AAC) is a leading national youth development organisation with the character and the values of the Australian Army.

As an Army cadet, you'll get to develop confidence, learn a range of skills, discover new challenges, make new friends and work as a member of a team.

The Army provides uniforms and most equipment needed, plus meals and accommodation is also provided on their annual camp. There is a small fee involved when cadets do weekend activities, usually a couple of times a year.

To join Army Cadets you must:

Be a resident of Australia

Be at least 12yrs, turning 13 in the same year (this has recently been changed)

Not have reached the age of 17

Agree to the code of conduct

Be available to participate in most Unit activities

Have parent/guardian consent
