Autism Inclusion Teacher (AIT)

Autism Inclusion Teachers are a new, nation-leading initiative which aims to build educator understanding and knowledge around supporting autistic children and young people.

Every public primary school in South Australia will appoint an Autism Inclusion Teacher. Our Autism Inclusion Teacher, Jacqui McCormack, has taken on the role one day per week.

It is anticipated that Autism Inclusion Teachers will first build their own teaching expertise, knowledge and understanding of autism through engaging in formal learning offerings and participation in the Autism Inclusion Teacher networks. To improve knowledge and practice across the school, Autism Inclusion Teachers will then be encouraged to share their learnings and resources with their colleagues to utilise in teaching autistic children and young people in their own classes.

2023 Pupil Free Days

We all have a role to play to ensure that children get the best education possible, and this starts with ensuring that **all** children attend school **all** day, **every** school day.

Attendance is a priority at Golden Grove Primary School. The more students attend, the more they learn and the more they will like school. Research also indicates that **regular attendance** leads to:

- Developing skills and attitudes such as self-discipline, punctuality, organisation and sticking to routines
- Making friends and learning how to maintain relationships over a period of time
- Learning social skills necessary to live and work with others

Parents/Caregivers are required to:

- Ensure that all children attend school from the beginning of each day (8:50am)
- Provide the school with an appropriate explanation for the student's non-attendance via a telephone call/SMS before 10am on the day of the absence
- Provide a medical certificate for extended absences (over 3 days) due to illness.
- Obtain a late slip from Student Services if students arrive after 8:50am and present to teacher on arrival at classroom
- Obtain an early dismissal slip from Student Services and present this to the classroom teacher if taking a child from school prior to 3:05pm
- Request a temporary exemption form from school for any known absences of five days or longer (ED175 forms available from the front office)
- Communicate to relevant school staff any needs or concerns which may affect a child's attendance

If your child is experiencing any barriers to attending school regularly, please contact me as soon as possible so that we can work together to address any issues.


