Teaching & Learning at GGPS

Dear Parents,

The students and teachers have been very busy making the most of all learning opportunities offered at school.

On our recent <u>Pupil Free Day</u>, teachers began their professional learning journey with Literacy Consultant, Bronwyn Custance. The 'Reading into Writing' work will continue all year and will build staff knowledge of traditional and functional grammar, in the context of teaching students to read and write narratives. Teachers have since worked in year level teams and actioned goals to implement back in class.



Teachers are looking forward to communicating and discussing Term 1 progress during the next few weeks. You will notice <u>'Learning Progress</u> <u>Updates'</u> and samples of work being sent home in either electronic or hard copy form. These updates are a 'snapshot' of your child's progress. <u>Parent/Teacher Interviews</u> will be held in Weeks 9 and 10. This will be an opportunity for teachers and parents to work together and discuss your child's progress, achievements and goals.

If you have not booked a time, please see further details on page 8. Please note, bookings close Wednesday 22 March.

Year 3 and 5 students are currently participating in <u>NAPLAN</u> testing in writing, reading, conventions of language and numeracy. Students undertake all test domains online, with the exception of the Year 3 writing test which is completed on paper. The online assessments are tailored tests that adapt to student responses, presenting questions that are more or less difficult – resulting in more precise results and a quicker turnaround of information for families and schools.

<u>Water Safety Lessons</u> will be held at Waterworld in Weeks 8 and 9. The program focuses on participation and confidence, and is designed to teach water skills and safety in a fun and safe environment. If you have not yet paid and you would like your child to attend, please ring Karen at the front office.

THE BUTTERFLY EFFECT

Science with Haylee Garner

In Science this term we are studying biology. Students have been exploring, investigating and discovering all about life cycles, growth and change, biomes, adaptations, microorganisms and more.

Last year we planted milk weed in our raised garden beds to attract butterflies so we could observe a life cycle just outside our Science classroom. Our milk weed thrived and we had so many caterpillars.



When caterpillars are ready to form their chrysalis, they don't necessarily stay on the milk weed. They can travel 10-15 metres away from their food source to form their chrysalis. As some of our caterpillars had quite the treacherous journey ahead, facing ants and being squashed, some year 6 students were taught how to pick them up and place them onto a nearby plant where they would be safe.

Some students and parents were lucky to witness the moment when the caterpillars turned into a chrysalis. An amazing opportunity to witness in person.

It became quite an event each time students lined up at class, to find as many chrysalises as they could. Some were attached to different fences, others on irrigation pipes, weeds, under tables and chairs, on different plants and on the trellises.



We brought some of the chrysalises into the class enclosure for students to witness a butterfly emerge. Luckily, we were able to record two of the 6 chrysalises hatching, both were during a class so students were able to watch it live. Students voted on a name and when it was ready, released it outside.



Our students learnt how to identify if a monarch butterfly was either a male or a female. Females are identified by the thick veins on their wings whereas males have thin veins and a black spot on each of the lower quadrants of its wings.
