#### Year 1/2:



#### Year 3/4:

#### Year 5/6:

Students have revisited Performing Arts expectations, routines and procedures. We have explored the dance elements of Tempo, Locomotor/Non-Locomotor, Direction and Dimension in our complicated version of Sambae. Many classes have also taken on a body percussion challenge of Sambae. We have also explored music from the 1960's throughout our Song Battle tasks.



#### Extra Curricular:

There are currently 145 students from Year 2-6 learning a musical instrument. This comprises of: 8 Flautists, 12 Clarinetists, 10 Saxophonists, 5 Trumpeters, 5 Tromboners, 14 Percussionists, 25 Guitarists and 56 Pianists. Red Rovers Band has commenced with 15 students and performed for the first time at our Performing Arts assembly. Blue Comets Band will commence in Term 2 with 40 students.

Senior Voices has 24 Year 5/6 students and have been focussing on our Festival of Music repertoire. They had a visit from Cathy Lange (Assistant Director of Music) from the Festival and performed 2 songs at our Performing Arts assembly.

**Primary Voices** has 46 Year 3/4 students and have been learning a few songs from our 2023 repertoire. They have been focussing on singing as a team and performed two songs at our recent Assembly.

**Bro Code** has 20 Year 4-6 boys and have been learning a bucket routine which was performed at our Performing Arts assembly. They are focussed on beat and tempo as well as working as an ensemble.

**Tinikling** currently has 27 students. They have been spending many lunchtimes learning all of the skills required in order to start choreographing our routine next term.
