#### **CBCA Shadow Judging**

As mentioned in our last newsletter, a dedicated group of Year 6 students from Golden Grove PS have participated for the first time in the Children's Book Council of Australia (CBCA) Shadow Judging program. They have read and critiqued the 6 shortlisted Younger Reader novels using the same criteria as the CBCA official judges. Their final vote was submitted along with a Creative Response to their chosen book.

Their nominated book, "Runt" by Craig Silvey, tells the story of Annie Shearer who lives in a country town called Upson Downs. She adopts a stray dog, affectionately known as Runt and the two of them share a special bond. It is a heart-warming and hilarious tale of kindness, friendship, being yourself and bringing out the best in others. One of our judges, Nate, told me that while he was reading 'Runt' he really didn't want it to finish, because it is so good and he'll be sad when it is over. We contacted author Craig Silvey to let him know the profound affect his story had on Nate, and indeed all of our judges, and he replied with the utmost gratitude and appreciation. He told us we are welcome in his fictional town of Upson Downs anytime and that we are honorary members of Team Shearer for life! And so, for our required creative response, we were inspired to dress up as the characters from the story with special guest Marvin standing in for Runt. Congratulations to our Shadow Judging team for their participation this year.

At Golden Grove Primary School we operate 2 Koala Crossings and provide traffic monitors to help supervise the safe crossing of all adults and children.

Recently, our crossing monitors have encountered many speeding vehicles and several vehicles that have gone through the crossing on a STOP signal.

We ask that you please adhere to the speed limit of no more than 25 km/hr and be vigilant and patient when driving through our school zones.

Families will notice a slight change to how the monitors are operating the crossing. The head monitor will blow the whistle twice. Once signs go up, the head monitor will give the command 'WALK'. Once children and families hear WALK they are safe to cross. This is an extra precaution we are introducing to ensure the safety of all pedestrians.
